
Paddle-to-the-Sea



Lesson 1

- 1. Read Chapters 1-3 of Paddle-to-the-Sea.
- 2. Discuss what the return of the geese signified to the Indian boy. (Spring)
- 3. Do some research on the Canadian geese. Where do they winter? How many miles do they fly? What special flight formations enable them to fly such distances? Record findings in notebook.
- 4. Describe how ballast works.
- 5. Label and color Lake Nipigon. (For reference see map at back of book.) Students may draw a tiny log cabin or a sketch of Paddle-to-the-Sea and paste it on the East side of Lake Nipigon. Color. Draw snow-capped mountains around Lake Nipigon.
- 6. Label and color Canada. Be sure to include the Canadian border above Maine.

Lesson 2

- 1. Read Chapters 4-6 of Paddle-to-the-Sea.
- 2. Do some research on ponds. A good resource would be the Eyewitness Book, <u>Pond and River</u>.
- 3. Begin a glossary at the back of notebook. Leave approximately 20 pages for definitions. In glossary define bull-chain or jack chain.
- 4. Draw a tiny red sawmill on the west side of Lake Nipigon. Mark in red the location of the sawmill on the map.
