

Questions Often Asked

Q. I know that *Daily Grams* are now at grade levels 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and Junior High/Senior High. What happened to *Daily Grams 6+* (green)?

A. *Daily Grams 6+* has been renamed *Daily Grams: Jr. High/Sr. High* level. The only change in this text is the addition of a "Content & Sequence" which states concepts reviewed and on which days these concepts appear. (All new *Daily Grams* include a "Content and Sequence.")

Q. How do *Daily Grams: Grade 3* and *Daily Grams: Grade 4* differ from the original *Daily Grams 3/4* & *Daily Grams 4/5*?

A. Many of the concepts are the same or similar within the new texts. However, more **explanations of concepts in initial reviews** are included. In addition, **sequencing in these texts has been changed to offer improved review.**

Q. How do *Daily Grams: Grade 5* and *Daily Grams: Grade 6* differ from the original *Daily Grams 4/5* & *Daily Grams 5/6*?

A. Although many items from the original texts have been maintained, **additional concepts have been included.** For example, the new books include 6 items per day; this allows for more review. Also, the new texts include **analogies** (*and how to do them*) and **spelling rules** (*with cyclic review*). Like *Daily Grams: Grades 3* and *Daily Grams: Grade 4*, **more teaching has been incorporated within the initial reviews.**

Q. Which is more difficult, *Daily Grams: Grade 7* or *Daily Grams: Junior High/Senior High*?

A. *Daily Grams: Junior High/Senior High* is more difficult; *little explanation* is offered. *Daily Grams: Grade 7* includes analogies and spelling (*which aren't included in the higher level*).

Q. Are *Daily Grams* student workbooks now available for each level?

A. **Yes**, *Daily Grams* workbooks and *Easy Grammar* workbooks are available. Workbooks are *cost effective* and *save teachers valuable time*.

Q. Are the *Daily Grams* and *Easy Grammar* books still reproducible for student non-commercial use?

A. **Yes**, and they are money-back guaranteed.

Q. I love the *Easy Grammar* teaching series; students love the step-by-step, easy-to-understand approach. However, must I use a *Daily Grams*?

A. No, but **daily reviews using these texts result in even more mastery of concepts.**
