VINCENT SHEEAN was born in Illinois and was educated at the University of Chicago. He started his career as a foreign correspondent for the Paris edition of the Chicago Tribune at the time of Mussolini's march on Rome. Sheean's best-known work, Personal History, is a record of his intellectual and emotional development and the political convictions he gained through his observations and experiences.

Mr. Sheean was in Austria and Czechoslovakia during the time of Hitler's annexations in 1938. He made two journeys into the Spanish Civil War during the same year, and for at least a decade he was likely to be present at most of the crises in Europe. He was in San Francisco for the organization of the United Nations, and in 1948 was present at the garden in India where Gandhi was assassinated.
