- 4. An antonym is a word of opposite meaning. Tell me an antonym for these words: short tall; float sink; loud quiet; wet dry. (These are only possible answers.)
- 5. A compound word is two words joined together to make a new word. What are the two words in these compound words: doghouse dog and house, mousetrap mouse and trap, rainbow rain and bow.
- 6. Tell me two words to describe a cat. Possible answers: white, black, fat, little, cute.
- 7. Repeat these words after me. Clap your hands for each syllable you hear. How many syllables are in these words: hamburger 3, carrot 2, joke 1
- 8. Tell me a rhyming word for these words: lake rake, make sake, wake, etc; went bent, sent, lent, dent, etc., man can, ban, fan, pan, etc.
- 9. A pronoun is a word that takes place of a noun. Listen to this sentence: Mary swam in the pool. Now, tell me the sentence again, replacing Mary with a pronoun. Repeat the sentence as necessary. She swam in the pool.
- 10. Which letter volume of encyclopedia would you use to find information on these topics: rabbits **R volume**, Texas **T volume**, hurricanes **H volume**.
