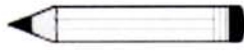


A Sample Lesson from The Red Student Book

Then he would try the next day.

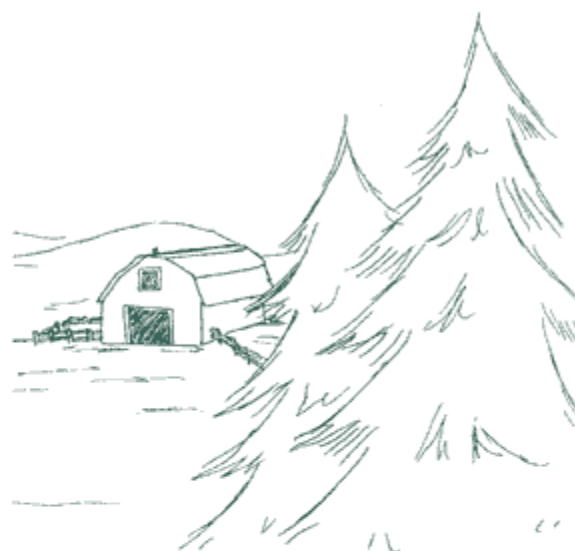


Little Sparrow fell ten times.
