Date:

Self-Government

- 1. Introduce the **Principle of Self-Government** from pages 269 and 270 of *America's Providential History*. Develop and write a definition of this principle.
- 2. Read the conclusion of Leif the Lucky.
 - a. Discuss how Eric the Red did and did not exercise self-government.
 - b. Discuss Proverbs 16:32.
- 3. Leif Erikson is a good example of self-government.
 - a. Leif becomes strong and cunning, swift as an arrow, and quiet as a mouse. Discuss the discipline and self-government needed to develop these qualities.
 - b. As a young man Leif is skilled enough in navigation to sail his own ship to visit the King of Norway. This is the fruit of his discipline.
 - c. Leif shows forethought and respect for protocol when he comes prepared with rare gifts for the King.
 - d. Leif remembers the counsel of his father when he waits until the King has eaten (see Proverbs 1:8,9).
 - e. Leif grooms himself before entering the King's presence.
 - f. When the King sees how well-mannered Leif is, he is invited to stay in court (see Proverbs 22:29). Contrast this with the humiliation of the gluttonous man.
