
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#### Alphabet Review


- 1. Look at the letters, both capital and small.

Draw lines between the capital letters and their small letter partners in each of the boxes.



As with all of your school work, always remember to ask God to help you learn and understand what your are doing. Thank Him for His help with every lesson.




# SHORT VOWELS
