





I: BEFORE ABRAHAM



I-I. The Garden of Eden. (Genesis 2:4–3:24; Ezekiel 3I:I–I8) Genesis describes the location of Eden in relation to the convergence of four rivers. While two of the rivers are unknown (the Pishon and the Gihon), the nearly universal identification of the other two rivers as the Tigris and the Euphrates suggests a possible location for Eden at either their northern or southern extremes.



I-2. Table of Nations,
c. 2200 B.C. (Genesis IO:I-32)
Many of the people groups
mentioned in Genesis IO can
be identified with relative
certainty. In general, the
descendants of Ham settled
in North Africa and the
eastern Mediterranean coast,
the descendants of Shem in
Mesopotamia and Arabia, and
the descendants of Japheth
in Europe and Asia Minor.
