


Free Fall



Hundreds of people stood along the banks of the Niagara River. They cheered as the barrel was dropped into the river. The barrel floated with the swift current toward the falls. The vowels are **a**, **e**, **i**, **o**, **u**, and sometimes **y** and **w**. All the rest of the letters are **consonants**. In most words, you can hear the sounds of several consonants. Listen for the **w**, **I**, and **d** sounds in <u>wild</u>. Sometimes a consonant in a word is doubled, but you hear it only once. Listen for the one sound the double consonants stand for in ba**nn**er and dollar.





Niagara Falls Is Worth the Trip


