

What does it take to make a superstar?

Shaping a Superstar

You are the producer of a space adventure movie. Your script calls for a **unique** character. You know that because of the character's size or some special quality, you may have trouble casting a person for the part. There may be no one for the role that will **qualify**.

What will you do? In this **technical** age, you can build your own character! Be prepared to spend a few hundred thousand dollars, though. You will probably need to hire sculptors, painters, and puppeteers to help you create your new "star."

Many space adventure movie "stars" were made this way.

Artists made **remarkable** numbers of sketches. Clay models were sometimes built. Then numbers of the final models, made of foam rubber, fiberglass, or plastic, were fit on metal frames.

People are usually surprised to learn how complicated these creatures really were. Some **required** three or four people to operate the controls. One person's entire job might have been moving one pair of eyes! A large creature might have had two or three people inside. Each had a different task. Together, the sounds and movements they made helped the creatures come "alive." **Knowledge** and technology have joined hands to shape superstars that can do almost anything but sign autographs!




