

Game Plan

Study these rules of syllabication.

Divide words where natural breaks occur between prefixes, roots, and suffixes: un/doubt/ed/ly. When two consonants come between two vowels, divide between the consonants: com/mem/o/rate. When one consonant comes between two vowels, divide before the consonant if the first vowel is long: ex/po/sure. Divide after the consonant if the vowel is short: sat/u/rate. A vowel sounded alone can form a syllable: cur//os/l/ty.


