
In this LIFEPAC®, you will learn about some of the things that happen in a community. You will learn how people help each other.

ambulance (am bu lance). A van that carries sick or hurt people.

area (ar e a). A certain amount of space.

baker (bak er). A cook, one who makes things to eat.

barber (bar ber). One whose job is cutting hair.

builder (build er). One who builds things like houses.

carpenter (car pen ter). One who works with wood or makes things out of wood.

Christian (Christian). One who has accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior.

clerk. One who helps shoppers in stores.

collector (col lec tor). One who collects things. (A trash collector gets the trash.)

community (com mu ni ty). A group of people who live in one area, with the same rules or laws.

compound (com pound). A word made up of two parts. (One compound word is milk-man, milkman.)

crops. Food or fruit grown by a farmer.

different (dif fer ent). Not like something else.

doctor (doc tor). One whose job is helping sick people get well.

farmer (farm er). One who raises crops for food.

fireman (fire man). One who puts out fires for a job.

fishermen (fish er men). Men who catch fish.

gas station (gas station). Place to get gas for cars and trucks.

group. A number of people together.

housewife (house wife). A woman who takes care of the home and family.

job. The work that a person does.

leader (lead er). One who leads others.

magazine (mag a zine). Papers put together like a small book.

mailman (mail man). One whose job is to bring letters and packages to homes.

minister (min is ter). A pastor or preacher.

missionary (mis sion ar y). One who tells others about God.

neighborhood (neigh bor hood). People who live near one another in a group of houses.

newspaper (news pa per). Paper telling the news in the community and the world.

New Testament (New Tes ta ment). The second part of the Bible which tells about Jesus.

nurse. One who works with doctors to help sick people get well.

ocean (o cean). A very large area of water.

package (pack age). A bundle of things wrapped together.

policeman (po lice man). One who helps keep us safe. One who helps people obey the rules or laws.

rancher (ranch er). One who raises animals.

rules. Laws we live by.

scissors (scis sors). A cutting tool with sharp blades.

sea. A large area of water.

shepherd (shep herd). One who takes care of sheep.

teacher (teach er). One who teaches, or tells others how to do things.

telephone (tel e phone). Something through which people talk to each other even when they are far apart.
