**grain.** The seed from wheat, corn, and other cereal grasses.

**habit** (ha bit). Something you are used to doing.

**harvest** (har vest). Gathering in the grain and other foods.

**income** (in come). The money that is earned.

**law.** Rules made for the people to live by.

**lily** (lil y). A plant with tall stems and bell-shaped flowers.

**piñata** (pi ña ta). A paper animal filled with candy for children.

**rice.** A grain.

**services** (serv ic es). Helping others.

**share.** To let others do something.

**shelter** (shel ter). Something that protects from weather or danger.

**special** (spe cial). Different from anything else.

**stocking** (stock ing). A covering for the leg.

**straw.** The stem left after grain is cut.

**trailer** (trail er). A house on wheels.

**wheat.** A grain.

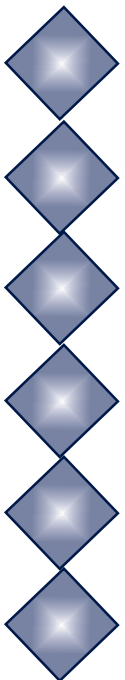
