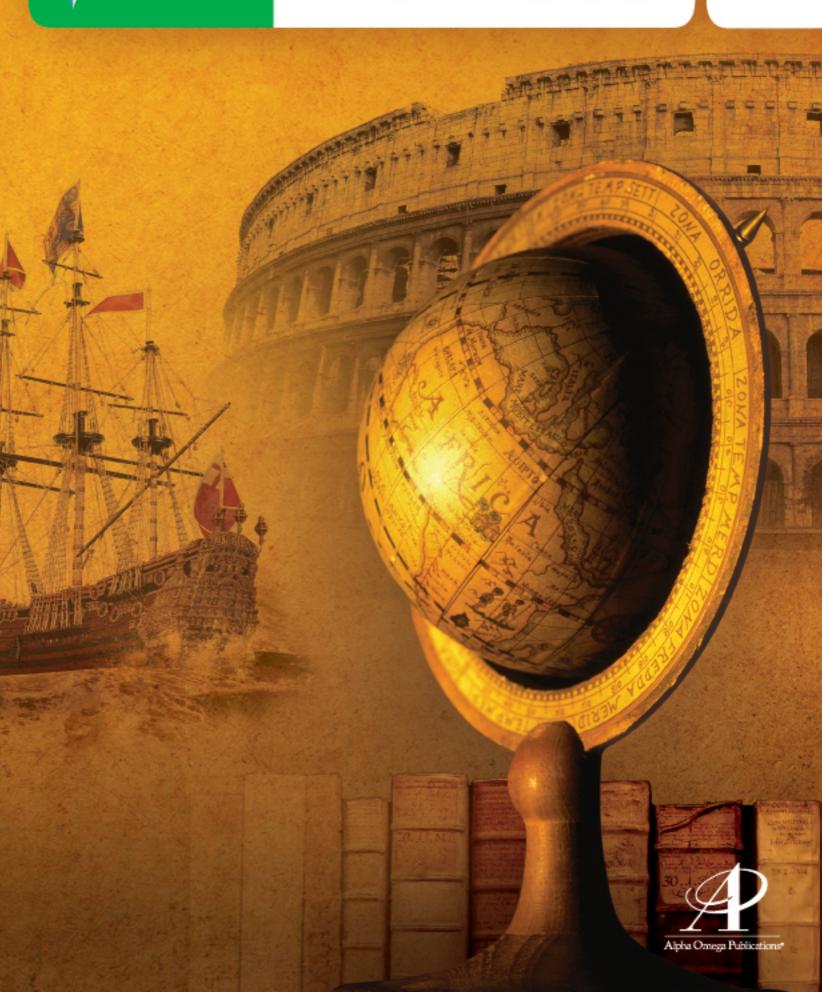

NEW WORDS

air conditioner (air con di tion er). Cools the air.

bicycle (bi cy cle). Has two wheels and is moved by using your feet and legs.

breathing (breath ing). To pull air into the lungs and then let it go out.

camels (cam els). Large animals with a hump on their backs. **carriage** (car riage). A small coach.

chariot (char i ot). Small wagons with two wheels, pulled by horses.

coach. Has four wheels and a roof and is pulled by horses.

contraction (con traction). To become smaller.

disciples (dis ci ples). The men who followed Jesus.

engine (en gine). A thing that gives power.

exercise (ex er cise). Moving the body to make you healthy. **exhaust** (ex haust). Fumes from a car.

expensive (ex pen sive). Costs a lot of money.

fishermen (fish er men). Men whose work is catching fish.

heater (heat er). Warms the air.

helicopter (he li cop ter). A special kind of airplane.

hoses (hos es). Used to carry water, gas, or other things.

law. A rule.

machine (ma chine). Does work for men and animals.

mules. Animals like horses.

oars. Long, wooden sticks to make a boat go.

pioneers (pi o neers). First people to go somewhere.

pollution (pol lu tion). Something made dirty.

present (pres ent). To give something; a gift.

problem (prob lem). Something to be worked out.

protect (pro tect). To keep from harm.

railroad (rail road). A place for a train to go.

rocket (rock et). A kind of engine.

rowboat (row boat). Small boat moved by oars.

sailboat (sail boat). Boat moved by wind in the sail.

sandals (san dals). A kind of shoe.

soldier (sol dier). A man in the army.

space. The area outside the earth's sky.

stagecoach (stage coach). A large coach used like a bus.

supersonic (su per son ic). Goes faster than sound.

supplies (sup plies). Things such as food and clothes, that people need to live.

travel (trav el). To move from place to place.

waste. Use too much of something when there is not enough. worship (wor ship). Bow down with love.
