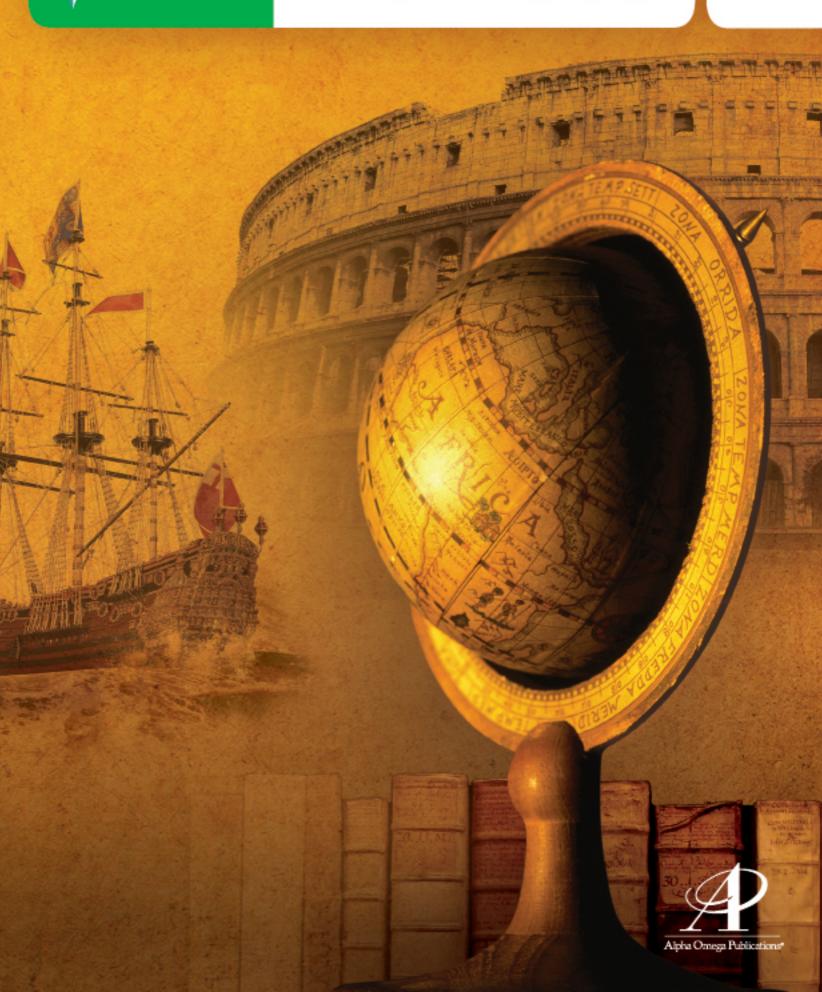

computer (com pu ter). A machine that can do mathematics and other things quickly.

crowds. A lot of people.

diary (di a ry). A daily record of events.

expression (ex pres sion). A look on a face showing the feelings of the person.

important (im por tant). Something that means a lot.

message (mes sage). Communication by writing or talking.

mime. Using only movements to show a story.

- **newspaper** (news pa per). A paper you can buy that tells you what is happening in the world.
- **papyrus** (pa py rus). A writing material, like paper, made from plants.
- parchment (parch ment). Skin of sheep or goat used for writing.
- **printing press** (print ing press). Machine for making a lot of copies of written things.
- problem (prob lem). Something wrong that needs to be fixed.
- **satellite** (sat el lite). A machine that circles the earth and helps send messages and signals.
- scribe. A person whose job is writing for other people.
- **scroll.** Papyrus or parchment rolled on two sticks for writing a message.
- **signal** (sig nal). To communicate by sound or action.
- tablets (ta b lets). Flat pieces of stone used for writing .
- telegraph (tel e graph). A way to send a message over wires.
- telephone (tel e phone). A way to talk to someone far away.
- **television** (tel e vi sion). An invention that sends pictures and sound through the air.
- **translator** (trans la tor). A person who can help two people with different languages to understand each other.



These words will appear in **boldface** (darker print) the first time they are used.

I. COMMUNICATION IN BIBLE TIMES

In Bible times people
communicated mostly by talking to
each other. Some things were put
in writing but many of the people
living then could not read or write.
The people could understand each
other through pictures or hand and
face messages, too. A nod of the
head or a hand wave would have
been as good as many words, just
as they are now.
