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

**public** (public). Place where a lot of people go.

punish (pun ish). Making someone pay for doing something
wrong.

recycle (re cy cle). Using things over again.

rooster (roost er). Father chicken who crows in the morning.

sewage (sew age). Wastes that come from our homes and bodies.

**smog.** The pollution in the air over large cities.

soil. Dirt.

trash. Things that are no longer good or useful.

waste. Something thrown away as useless.
