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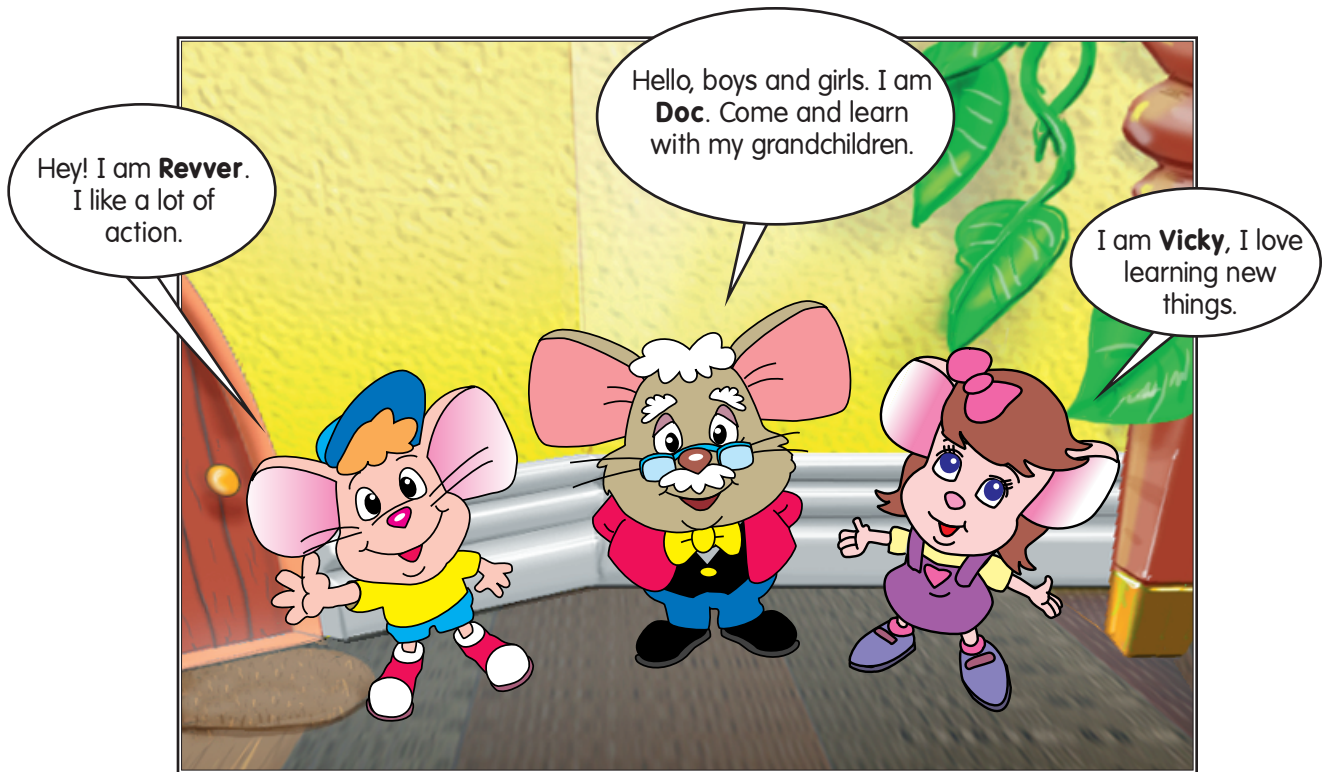
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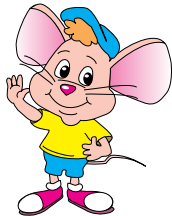

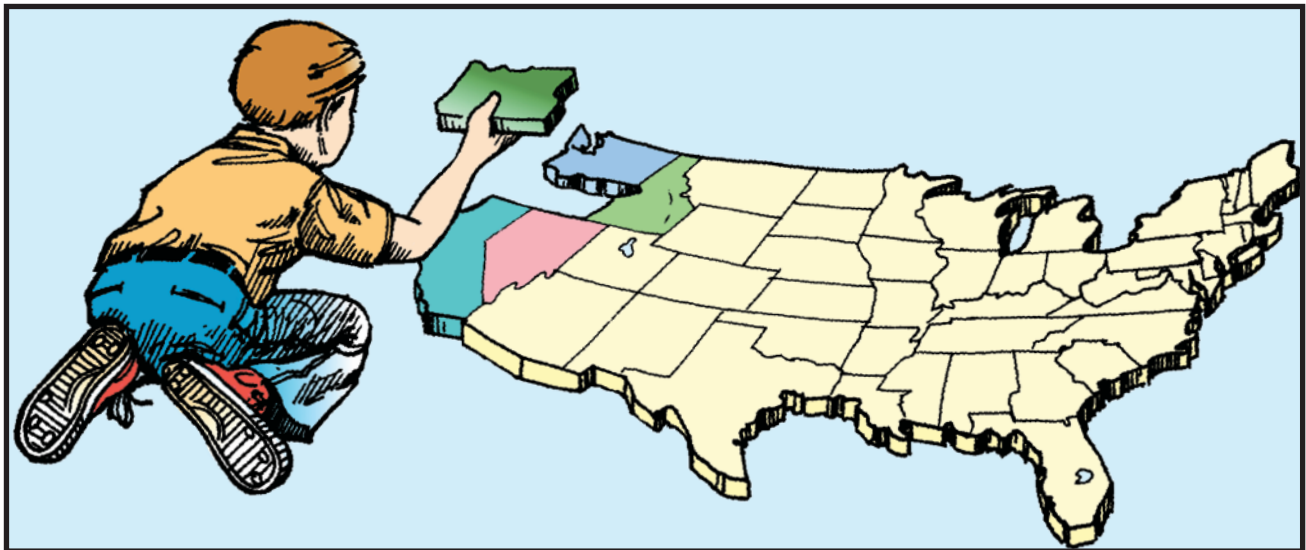

annual (an nu al). Coming every year.

ape The logger who saws off the tree top.

ax A sharp tool used for chopping.

barber chair (bar ber chair). A tree stump that has ragged edges.

canvas (can vas). A heavy cloth.

cat skinner (cat skin ner). A logger who pulls logs to the trucks.

chemical (chem i cal). Something used to stop fires.

chopper (chop per). A logger who chops a notch in a tree.

community (com mu ni ty). All the people living in the same place.

conifer (con i fer). A tree that has cones.

dynamite (dy na mite). Something used to blow things into small pieces.

fire spotter (fire spot ter). The man who lives in the forest and watches for fires.

gopherman (go pher man). A logger who removes the tree trunks.

grader (grad er). A logger who sorts the lumber into poor, better, or best qualities.

hatchet (hatch et). A small ax.

high climber (high climb er). The logger who cuts off the short branches of the tall trees.

jack ladder (jack lad der). The ramp used to move logs into the sawmill from the water.

jack monkey (jack mon key). The logger who works at moving the logs up the jack ladder.

jagged (jag ged). With sharp points sticking out.

kiln Oven for drying.

lava (la va). The hot rock flowing from a volcano.

logging show (log ging show). The name of the logging work from start to finish.

lumber (lum ber). Timber that has been cut into boards.

lumberjack (lum ber jack). A man who works in the forest.

metal (met al). A very hard material.

nursery (nurs er y). A place where plants are grown.

peeler picker (peel er pick er). The logger who chooses the cut trees that will be sent to the sawmill.

product (prod uct). Anything that is made.

rigger slinger (rig ger sling er). The logger who fastens the logs so the lifting machine can move them.

river rat (riv er rat). The logger who works with the logs on the river.

selfish (sel fish). Caring too much for yourself and caring too little for others.

smoke jumper (smoke jum per). The man who jumps from a plane to fight fires in the forest.

spike A sharp pointed piece.

stomach robber (stom ach rob ber). The cook in the lumber camps.

stump The lower part of the tree left after the top is cut off.

timber (tim ber). Trees or forests that give wood for building.

tractor (trac tor). A powerful engine with wheels used to pull things.

trail blazer (trail blaz er). The logger who cuts roads into the forest where the cutting is to be done.

tree spotter (tree spot ter). The logger who picks out the trees to be cut.

volcano (vol ca no). A mountain with an opening from which steam and lava come out.

watch tower (watch tow er). The tall building where the men watch for forest fires.

waterproof (wat er proof). Able to keep water from coming in.

worm An animal that has no legs.
