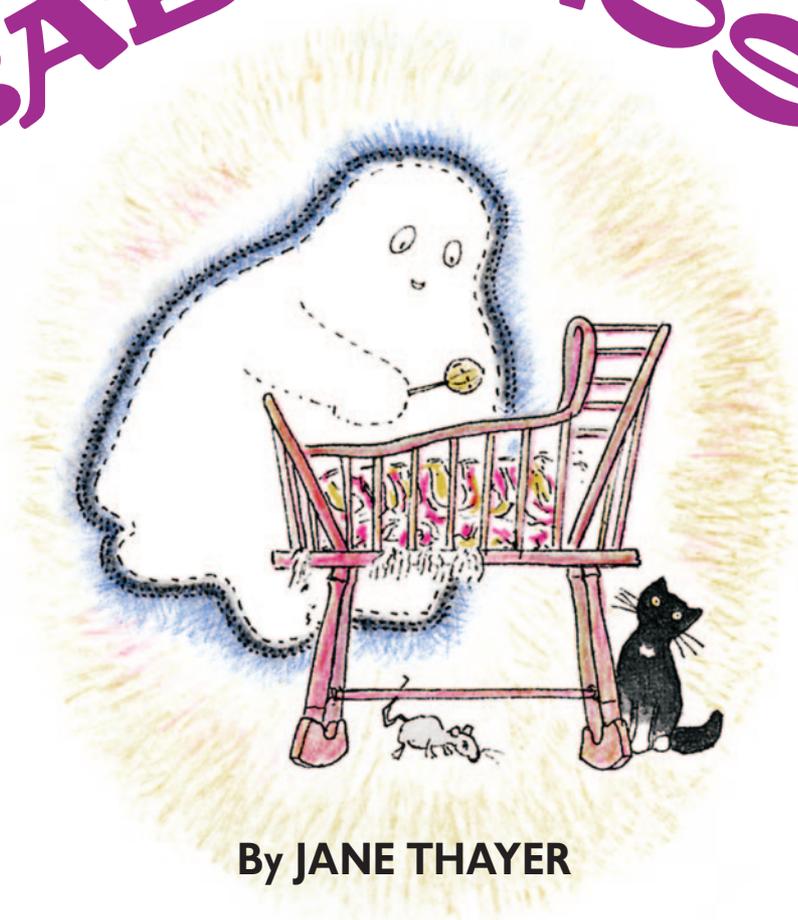

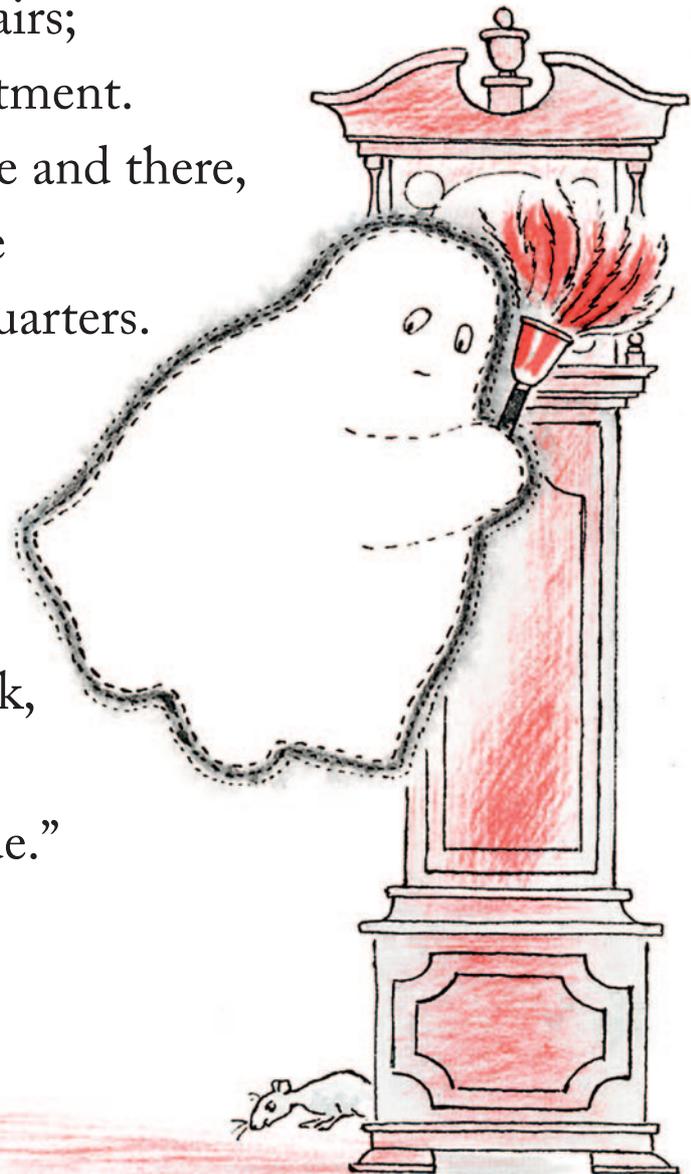

and found some milk.

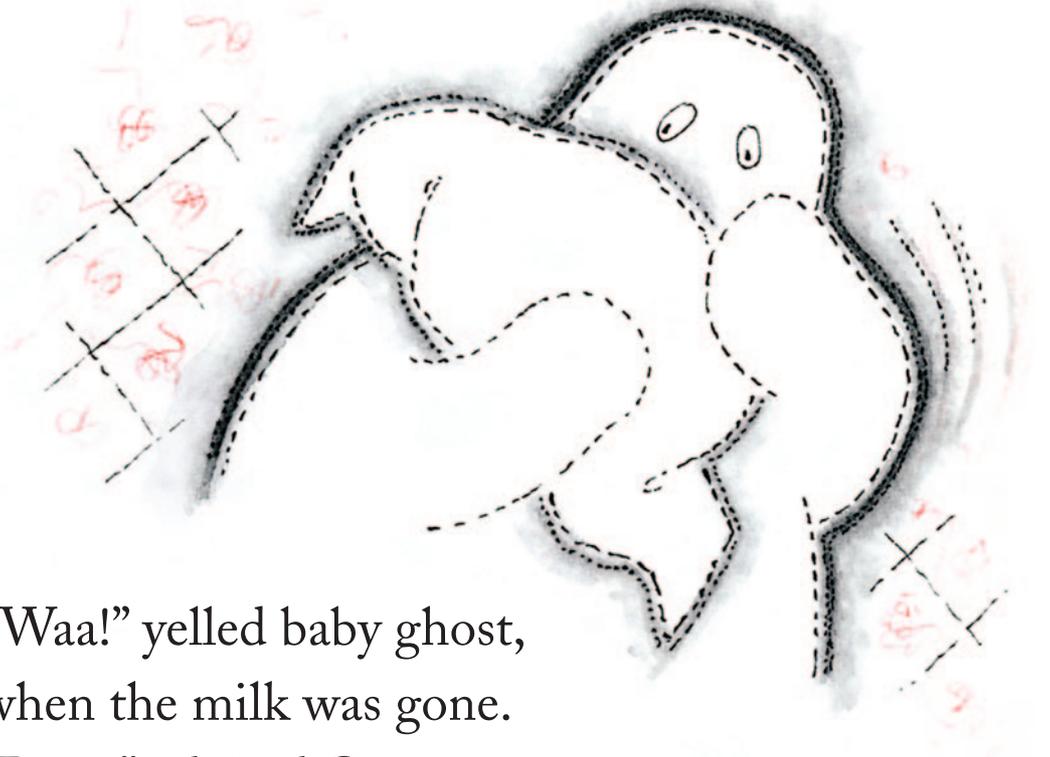
“Warm,” advised Cora.
