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"A" IS FOR APPLE

Supplies:

- 12 red paper strips (1" x 9")
(1 sheet of red construction paper, cut 12 times on the short side)
- 1" strip brown construction paper
- 2 green leaves printed on green construction paper
- 2 large brads
- hole punch
- scissors

Teacher Guidelines:

1. Have the children cut out the green leaves with scissors.
2. Fold the brown strip in half.
3. Stack the red strips on top of each other and have the teacher punch a hole through the entire stack, about 1/2" from the short edge. Place a brad in the hole and secure.
4. At the opposite end, on top of the red strip stack, place both leaves and the brown stem. Punch a hole through the entire stack. Secure with a brad. It will look like this:



5. To finish, separate each strip and rotate it so that it rounds and forms a slice of apple. See picture.



"B" IS FOR BAT

Supplies:

Teacher Guidelines:

1. Have each child paint their toilet paper roll completely, using black paint. Set aside to dry.
2. Use the wing template to trace wings onto a piece of black construction paper. Set aside.
3. When roll is completely dried, place your thumbs on opposite sides of the top "ring" and push down into the roll. This should form two "bat ear" points that will be left standing up.
4. Glue on two googly eyes, near the top. Glue wings on the backside of the bat. Finally, glue the string to the outside of the wings, and allow the project to sit for 2 hours, or until glue is set.
